## **WAILEA EKAHI VILLAGE HURRICANE POLICY**

Once it has been confirmed that a hurricane level storm is coming, the following procedures will be put into effect:

### **SECURITY**

1. Monitor storm warnings at **mauicounty.gov** Emergency Management Agency and inform the Association of all updates.
2. Answer all incoming calls on security phone, answer questions accordingly and assist owners and guests in person if approached.
3. Verify all Pavilion furnishings are secured, if no other means, place in pools.
4. Umbrellas will be dismantled and stored and any items on the walls (pictures, etc.) will be stored or secured.

### **MAINTENANCE**

1. Monitor storm warnings at **mauicounty.gov** Emergency Management Agency.
2. Wailea Ekahi has two staff employees designated as our **on-site Emergency Coordinators**. Guy Kiaha, our Maintenance and Security Director who can be reached at 808-214-2616 and "Junior" Sabas, also Maintenance and Security, he can be reached at 808-446-1825.
3. Check and stock all emergency supplies and first aid kits and ensure they are found in their proper locations.
4. Use plywood to secure any window areas deemed susceptible to high wind breakage.
5. Load cooler with water bottles and move to break room.
6. Verify shop has window open to stop vacuum from forming.
7. Secure golf carts and verify tools are secure.
8. Fill buckets of water and place near bathrooms as water may be off.
9. Assist Security with securing Pavilion as necessary.
10. Move all pool furniture inside, if no other means, place in pools.

## **WAILEA EKAHI VILLAGE TSUNAMI PREPAREDNESS & SAFETY INFORMATION**

Tsunamis (Japanese term meaning wave in the harbor) are a threat in the Pacific Basin which includes Hawaii.

- **LOCAL EARTHQUAKE:** May cause you to fall or have difficulty standing. This is a natural tsunami warning. Initially protect yourself from earthquake effects. When shaking stops leave the evacuation areas immediately.
- **URGENT TSUNAMI WARNING:** Possible tsunami generated by a significant earthquake in local waters. Sirens will sound. Turn on radio to KMVI radio station (98.5 FM). If an urgent tsunami warning is announced, leave for the evacuation areas immediately.
- **TSUNAMI WATCH:** Significant distant earthquake has occurred. Tsunami approach not confirmed but possible. No siren sounded. Prepare for possible upgrade to Tsunami Warning.
- **TSUNAMI WARNING:** Tsunami approach confirmed. Sirens will sound. Monitor radio. Be prepared to evacuate when advised/ordered by Civil Defense.
- **TSUNAMI EVACUATION:** Sirens will sound, turn on radio. Those who are in the evacuation area must begin evacuation when the evacuation advisory/order has been given by Civil Defense.

## **WAILEA EKAHI VILLAGE TSUNAMI POLICY**

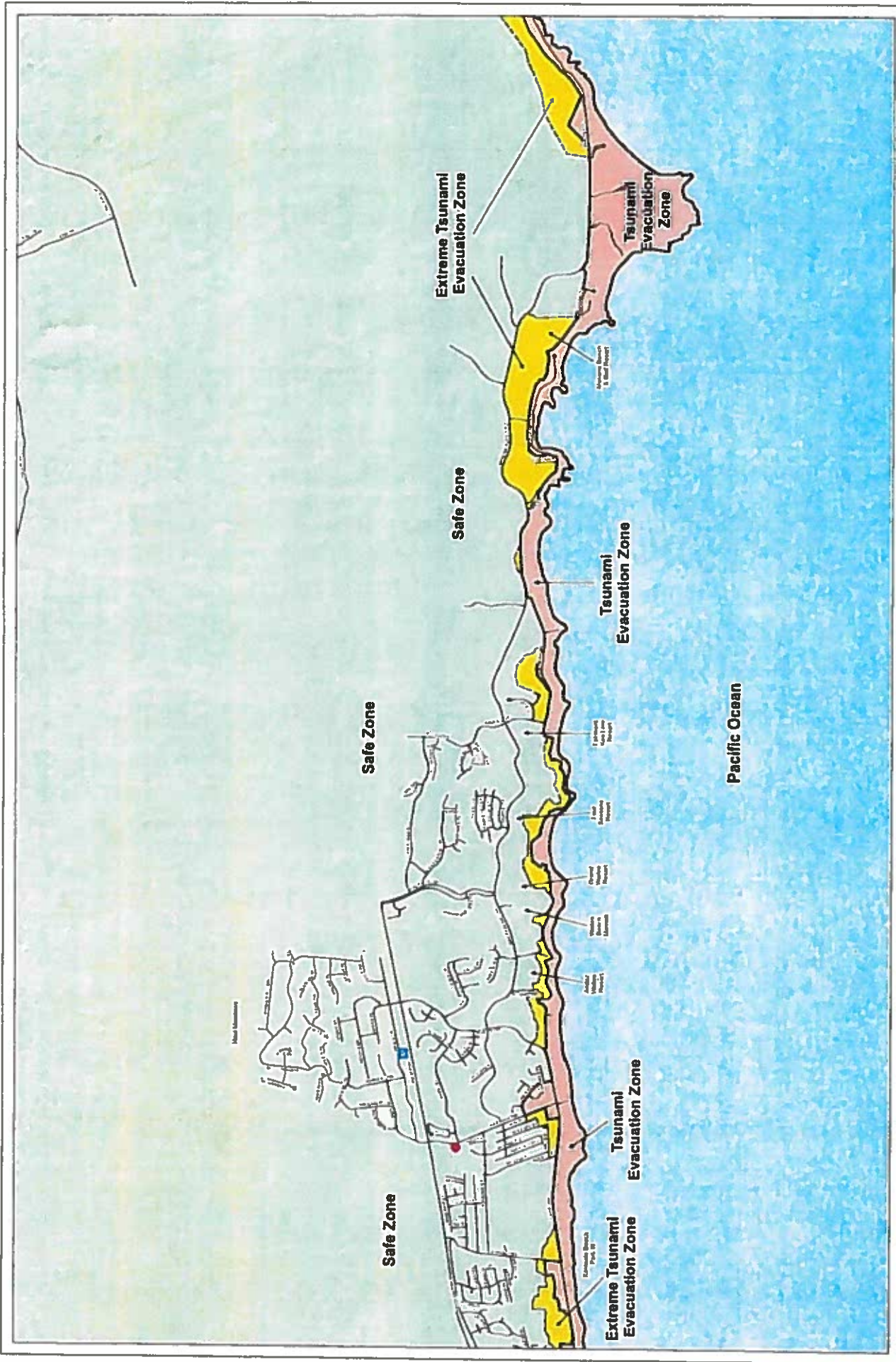
Once it has been confirmed a tsunami has been generated and sirens have sounded, the following procedures will be put into place:

### **SECURITY**

1. Security and office staff will answer phones calls and questions. See Personal Preparedness Plan.
2. Security will advise all guests that they should evacuate to shelters, as listed on the Personal Preparedness Plan.
3. See Emergency Survival Kit.
4. Monitor KMVI station (98.5 FM) for estimated time the tsunami will arrive.

### **MAINTENANCE**

1. Move golf carts to Building 47 near landscape equipment.
2. Move as many tools as possible from the maintenance shop.
3. Monitor KMVI station (98.5 FM) for updates.

  - Tsunami Evacuation Zone

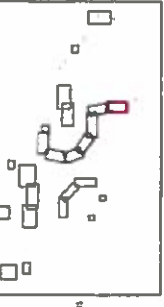


Structural code of reinforced concrete buildings of all or every column provide horizontal projection in or along the fourth floor. If you are through the building structure using vertical evacuation.

There is no way to consider the duration of stay at a facility and avoid from the red danger evacuation zone.

The evacuation zone is a guideline and should be considered the maximum safe evacuation distance.

For maps to show blue sky, outside of the red zone in the vicinity of the "Extreme Tsunami Warning" include all of the 191 and 192 of the 191 and 192. The "Extreme Tsunami Warning" and "Extreme Tsunami Evacuation Zone" are shown in red. The "Extreme Tsunami Evacuation Zone" is shown in yellow. The "Extreme Tsunami Evacuation Zone" is shown in pink. The "Extreme Tsunami Evacuation Zone" is shown in light blue. The "Extreme Tsunami Evacuation Zone" is shown in dark blue. The "Extreme Tsunami Evacuation Zone" is shown in light green. ## **WAILEA EKAHI VILLAGE NUCLEAR DETONATION POLICY**

The following are indicators of an impending attack:

1. Sirens sound Warning Signal
2. Emergency Alert System (EAS) Advisory
3. Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) System Advisory

If these indicators are activated, the following plan will be put into effect:

1. All staff immediately report to the conference room in Building 18, close all doors/windows and listen to radio station **KMVI (98.5 FM)** for updates.
2. Advise owners/guests of steps to take in a suspected nuclear detonation located on the **Guidance for Nuclear Detonation Threat** document.

## **WAILEA EKAHI VILLAGE EMERGENCY SURVIVAL KIT**

### **Overview:**

Use the following list as a guideline when preparing your Emergency Survival Kit:

- . Four-week supply of prescription medicines
- . Five-day supply of non-perishable food
- . Non-perishable special dietary foods
- . Ice chest
- . Water - a minimum of two quarts per person per day
- . Pet food
- . Candles
- . Matches
- . Fuel for stoves, hibachis or lanterns
- . Pillows, blankets, sleeping bags or air mattresses
- . Flashlights, batteries and extra bulbs
- . Portable radio and extra batteries
- . Extra clothing, eyeglasses
- . Masking tape for windows and glass doors
- . Personal hygiene items such as toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, etc.
- . Special items for infants, elderly or family members with special needs
- . Quiet games, books, playing cards and favorite toys for children
- . Important papers including driver's license, special medical information, insurance policies and written or videotaped property inventories
- . First aid kit and purification kit (tablets or chlorine available at drug stores)



## **WAILEA EKAHI VILLAGE PERSONAL PREPARATION PLAN**

### **Overview:**

Take the following steps to help prepare you and your family for a disaster:

- Be prepared. Make sure all family members know what to do in case of an emergency.
- Decide where the family will meet if separated, where you will seek shelter, and what you will take with you if you must evacuate.
- If an emergency occurs, remain calm. Follow your plan. Listen to the radio or television for instructions and information.
- Fill sinks and bathtubs with water.
- Know warning signals and shelter locations (see below):
